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ABOUT OUR PROJECT

Erasmus+ KA210 SCH - 'ACToVER' project is financed by the European Union with partners from Belgium, Türkiye, Norway and Spain.

OBJECTIVES OF OUR PROJECT

Our project aims to build strong environmental awareness among students, teachers, parents, and communities. We focus on protecting nature, saving energy, reducing pollution, and promoting sustainable habits such as recycling and reusing.

Students will learn about biodiversity, climate change, and the importance of water and animals while developing a love and respect for nature. Through gamification, they will take part in fun, interactive activities like quizzes and challenges that make learning enjoyable.

The project also helps participants improve their English, creativity, teamwork, and digital competence using WEB 2.0 tools to create posters, games, videos, and stories.

Expected outcomes include a Teaching Pack with lesson plans, a Game Library, a Digital Booklet, Stories, a Website, a Documentary, Podcasts, an e-Magazine, and Erasmus Forests in each partner country to leave a lasting green impact.
